

In **Maths**, children will build on their knowledge and understanding of multiplication, division and perimeter.

In **English**, children will further develop their skills in story writing, diary writing and letter writing, through both their English and Topic lessons.

How you can help at home:

High expectations of presentation in all areas, including uniform and written work. Practise weekly spellings and multiplication tables.

Ensure your child is reading aloud and discussing a text regularly *and* that their reading record is up to date.

LET'S CELEBRATE EUROPE

As **Scientists**, children will learn about the simple functions of the basic parts of the digestive system in humans. They will identify different types of teeth in humans and their simple functions.

In **Art**, children will be exploring the use of colour to express mood, focussing on the Russian artist Kandinsky. We will also be designing Faberge eggs for Christmas decorations.

In **PSHCE**, we will be considering personal responsibility – hygiene, diet, exercise and sleep, illness, wellbeing and balance. As well as continuing a focus on anti-bullying.

In **Computing**, children will be learning how to use a variety of software to present information.

In **Geography**, children will be learning about the physical and human characteristics of various places throughout Europe and learn how to locate various places using a map.

In **PE**, children will be continuing developing their invasion games skills. During indoor PE they will be learning to ballroom dance with a partner.

In **RE**, children will find out what Hindus believe that God is like? They will identify some Hindu deities and how they help Hindus describe God. They will identify ways Hindus worship.

In **DT**, children will be developing their cooking skills and techniques through making savoury dishes from other cultures.

In **Music**, children will be composing their own music, which they will learn to represent with their own personal graphic notation, which will build to a piece of art work that represents their music.
